#### Fluency Tips, Tricks, and Strategies for Elementary Students

#### What is Fluency?

Fluency is the ability to read a text accurately, quickly, and with expression. Fluency is important because it provides a bridge between word recognition and comprehension. When fluent readers read silently, they recognize words automatically. They group words quickly to help them gain meaning from what they read. Fluent readers read aloud effortlessly and with expression. Their reading sounds natural, as if they are speaking. Readers who have not yet developed fluency read slowly, word by word. Their oral reading is choppy.





## Harry's Hiccups



#### Fluency Tips, Tricks, and Strategies for Middle School/High School

Improving a student's reading fluency can have a positive impact on his/her comprehension and success in other classes. Having better fluency and comprehension can reduce a student's frustration. One of the keys in improving fluency is to start at the student's level. If a student is in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, but feels more comfortable reading a 5<sup>th</sup> grade level book, let him/her start there. Below are a few strategies to help students improve fluency:

- **Echo Reading** You model by reading a passage out loud, and then the student reads the same passage to you.
- Repeated Reading Have students read the same page more than once.
  Each time should get easier, which helps build fluency and confidence.
- Write a Reflection Have the student write a reflection about a passage to help process the story elements in his/her mind.
